

Deadheading Seminar and Volunteer Day May 7th, 9am

We will demonstrate the proper techniques to deadhead roses, and keep them blooming throughout the season. We will use these techniques to get the Garden in tip-top shape for the busiest day of the year - **Mother's Day.**

Every year we work very hard to get as many people out to the Rose Garden Annual Pruning. Seems a lot of people like to get training on how to properly prune their roses. Of course, it helps bring people out when Star Roses gives a free bare root rose to every volunteer that arrived! In the past, we've had several hundred and have pruned the Garden typically in a little over 90 minutes.



Plans are being drawn up to take care of "refreshing" these features. Stay tuned, we hope to get everything done before the end of this year!




Aphids and Ladybugs

Right now you should see a lot of healthy, new growth on your roses. It is possible you may also find some critters feasting on this new growth. Usually these little green insects will be aphids and can do a great deal of damage.


One of the easiest methods of getting rid of aphids is just taking a hose and carefully spraying them off. It's good enough to knock them to the ground. Aphids are poor climbers. You can also just squish them between your fingers, or flick them off. I can imagine hearing their screams as they fly through the air!

We haven't had much aphid infestation in the Garden over the years. We are quite fortunate. Just a block away, I've seen roses in front yards covered with the little buggers.

It may be because we are proactive in our methods. We tend to release lady bugs every month during the growing season. It's a great organic way to control aphids. There is nothing ladybugs like more than a gourmet dinner of aphids! YUM! These beneficial insects have an inexhaustible appetite. We



So do what we do, and get some ladybugs, and let them know the Friends of the San Jose Rose Garden sent you - they might throw in a few extra ladybugs. ;-)





Pizza is the Key to our Master Volunteer Program



Along with the 4 large, well attended community volunteer days, our Master Volunteer Program is vital to the success of the Rose Garden. After Councilmember Pierluigi Oliverio got the union rules changed to allow "public/private" partnerships in the City Parks, the Master Volunteer Program became a reality. Our Master Volunteers are trained in our special techniques, and have the ability to come into the Garden and volunteer on their own time. On any given day, you will see these green vested champions. Not only do they help keep the roses blooming, they serve as ambassadors, answering many questions visitors may have, and receiving oodles of gratitude from the visitors. Each year, we train dozens of new Master Volunteers. It usually takes about 1.5 hours for the training. After the training, they are free to come and volunteer on their own time. After 5 hours, they become "vested". But what's the deal about pizza? Well, in my years, I have learned that pizza is a great unifier. So 9 years ago, I approached Bryan Garrett, owner of Cafe Rosalena and Rosie's New York Pizza, among other ventures. Bryan is a longtime friend and lives just one block from the Garden. He certainly remembers when the Garden was in bad shape. Bryan let me know that he would support our efforts, and the Pizza Work Party concept was born. As a Master Volunteer, you will get emails letting you know to come out on a specific night for a work party, or rose care seminar, and celebrate with some of Rosie's New York Pizza and their famous salads. It's not unusual to have 20 Master Volunteers show up. If you have the chance, stop by Rosie's and let them know you appreciate their support of "America's Best Rose Garden".

The new bed is located near the front of the main gates of the Garden. We grew this rose in the test beds, so we know it's a real beauty.

I put the sign up promoting the "Name this Rose" competition well before the rose even bloomed. Which led me to this fun story: The same day I put up the sign, my iPhone buzzed letting me know I had an email entry with a suggested name.
